The South32 goal is to have 80% local workforce who lie and work in Santa Cruz County currently, Current Local employment is at 46%. The vision for workforce is uplifting the community through education.

South32 and local partners are looking to establish a local Electrician Certificate Program

- Identifying how to reduce barriers for potential applicants
- The first group will be fully funded
- Striving for diversity in all facets

The Electrician Program was started first as it has the greatest need and the longest lead time. The intent of the first cohort/class is that South32 can attract the students it needs.








Centro Side View


